***You May Have Heard about the Gold 'Discovery' in the Transboundary Flathead***

The recent announcement by Max Resources Corporation of its gold discovery in the Flathead is not new news. Traces of the precious metal have been found for years. Over the past decade an exploration company, [Eastfield Resources](#), reported gold bearing rock formations in the Howell Creek area, a tributary of the Transboundary Flathead.

What's new - and noteworthy - is that Max Resources has discovered samples of gold-bearing rock with higher metal concentrations.

***Where Is the Max Property Located?***

Max Resources has optioned two of Eastfield Resources gold properties in the Canadian Flathead: the Howell Creek and Crowsnest properties. Both are located adjacent to Howell Creek.

Max Resource's latest press release focused on the Crowsnest property that is located on "Trachyte Ridge" directly overlooking the Flathead River. (Click [here](#), or the map at right to see details of the location.)
